

Faculty Seminar Series: Teaching for Civic Engagement & Social Change

Join fellow faculty from across the Associated Colleges to engage in a **monthly dialogue** about **pedagogical practices** aimed at motivating and preparing students to be active leaders and agents of social change in their professions and communities. Seminar discussions will be prompted by a few brief reading selections (e-mailed in advance) and will raise such questions as:

- How do/can we prepare students to be agents of change in their professions and workplaces, civic communities, and the wider world?
- How do we promote diversity/multiculturalism/anti-racism and prepare our students for cross-cultural interactions?
- How do we encourage a sense of efficacy among our students (as opposed to hopelessness, burn-out, etc.)?
- How do we achieve reciprocity while teaching in and with the community?

The seminar series will be facilitated by **Dr. Heather Sullivan-Catlin** (Sociology Dept. and Faculty Service-Learning Liaison at SUNY Potsdam) and will culminate in a session with **Dr. Keith Morton** (Associate Professor of Public and Community Service Studies at Providence College). **Keith Morton's** work focuses on the areas of community development, community service and community theory. He has also worked as program and executive director of the University of Minnesota YMCA and as director of Campus Compact's national Project on Integrating Service with Academic Study.
